You can check your P60 online

Don't forget, if you need to complete a self-assessment tax return you can view and print your 2019/20 P60 easily by registering for an [MPO account](#). You can also access previous P60s along with your monthly payslips, as well as send us secure messages.

We'll be in touch next year when your 2020/21 P60 becomes available.



Be scam aware

It's important to be aware of pension scams and how to protect yourself against them. The Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) [provide information](#) on what to do if you think you've been targeted.

Warning signs that someone is trying to scam you include:

- Contact that comes out of the blue also known as a “cold call”
- Someone placing pressure on you to make a decision
- Promising unrealistic returns on investment.

Returning to teaching?

Transitional Protection

You may have heard about the government's consultation on proposals to address the discrimination caused by the transitional protection arrangements, when the career average scheme was introduced in 2015. The consultation is now closed and the government are now considering the various responses and will publish its response in due course.

Power of Attorney changes

If you've a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) in place it's important to let us know.

For any LPA registered in England or Wales on or after 17 July 2020, you can use the [new online service](#). The service will allow us to check an LPA online, and means that you won't need to send us paper copies.

If the LPA was put in place before 17 July 2020, you'll still need to send an original or certified copy of the document.

Pensions board

We currently have a member representative vacancy on the Teachers' Pension Scheme Pension Board (TPSPB).

Pension Boards were set up to allow for transparency in public service pension schemes. The TPSPB has been running since 2015.

The successful candidate will not need to be a pension expert but should be able to demonstrate skills and experience detailed in the role and person specification.
